

What is Sanctity of Human Life Sunday?

Sanctity of Human Life Sunday is observed each year on the third Sunday of January or the Sunday closest to January 22, the anniversary of Roe v. Wade. It is a day that we observe with believers across the United States has set aside to remember those babies we've lost to the atrocities of abortion.

January 2021, will mark the 48th anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision.

This Day of Remembrance has come and gone over the years. In 1984, President Ronald Reagan made the designation for **Sanctity of Human Life Sunday**, which his successor, President George H.W. Bush, continued throughout his presidency. Bush's successor, President Bill Clinton, discontinued the practice, but Bush's son and Clinton's successor, President George W. Bush, resumed the proclamation when he took office. The proclamation was again discontinued in 2010 under President Barack Obama, to be reinstated by President Donald Trump, who recognized the day at the onset of his presidency.

The pro-life community continues to set this day aside each year since its inception in 1984 to pray for an end to abortion.

Many people are unaware of the true impact abortion has had on our nation and our community.

If we honored each baby aborted since 1973 with a moment of silence, we would be silent for more than 100 years.
